- Geared towards bright and independent undergraduate students with strong interest in research: 3.4 GPA or higher required
- Intensive, research-oriented semester or academic year at one of 8 prestigious universities in Europe
- Transfer of academic credits. Earn up to 30 ECTS / equivalent to 15 US credits per semester. Each semester of study is considered full-time study.
- All research and deliverables are conducted in English
- Projects are available in **all disciplines**: STEM fields, humanities, social sciences, business & finance, etc.
- Culture a/o Language course provided at each university
- Midstay programme: allows students to network, and present their research findings to date.
- Student facilities at host university.
- Supervision of the research project.
