Research Opportunities Abroad for High- Achieving Undergraduates

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Research Abroad?

This session will highlight two program models for facilitating international research at the undergraduate level:

- <u>EuroScholars Undergraduate Research Program</u>- Semester and year-long opportunities to join research teams at one of nine prestigious European universities.
- <u>ISA Internships</u> 10-week internships through International Studies Abroad (ISA), which allow students to engage in research while honing their professional and academic skill sets.

Both opportunities provide students with the option for **academic credit** and **supervised research experience**, and both are open to students from **all academic disciplines**.

EuroScholars Research Abroad

- EuroScholars is a unique, research-intensive study abroad program designed for talented and advanced undergraduate students.
- The program combines a study abroad experience with the opportunity to join a research team and participate in an ongoing investigation at a European research university.
- EuroScholars is an autonomous program managed by a consortium of the 9
 participating institutions, for which ISA serves as the North American representative
 providing marketing and admissions support.



Program Objectives

- To choose an academic research project from a variety of fields within the participating institutions
- To join the existing research team and gain hands-on experience, under the direct supervision of university faculty
- To collaborate with like-minded students, both local and international
- To document their research in a paper of publishable quality
- To develop professionally and have the opportunity to explore research as a career- option
- To advance their intercultural and scholarly skills





Program Details

- Each semester of study is transcripted by the host university in Europe and is considered full-time study, with the primary academic focus being on the research project
- All research and deliverables are conducted in English
- A culture and language course is included in the program
- Mid-stay program allows students to network, experience a new city, and present their research findings to date
- Projects are available in all disciplines: STEM fields, humanities, social sciences, business & finance, etc.
- Geared toward bright and independent students with strong interest in research; 3.4 GPA or higher required



Chapman University Course

- **Pre-Departure Paper** regarding expectations and objectives for the internship.
- **Bi-weekly Placement Activity Plans** connecting student objectives and related observational tasks completed with the host-site supervisor
- **Student Analysis and Reflection** of the entire learning experience is submitted at the end of the internship.
- Mid-Placement and End-of Placement Evaluation will be completed by the host-site supervisor. This report is meant to give an overall assessment and professional evaluation of the student intern based on the intern's professional development.

Sample Research-Based Placements

SARDI- South Australia Research & Development Institute, Aquatic Sciences Centre Marine Biology Research Assistant Intern


- Sortdeep-sea infaunal and epifaunal samples into higher order taxonomic groups and assist with lower order identification.
- Assist with processing sediment samples to determine organic carbon content and grain size distribution
- Assist with processing seagrass samples to determine biomass, stem length, epiphyte loads etc.
- Assist with studies on algal eco-physiology and reproduction

Goldsmiths, University of London,

Cognitive Research Intern

Research is concerned with the executive control of memory and how this relates to identity and the social world.

- Look at social factors, such as forgiveness, and how this impacts memory performances
- Collect data, transcribe, record memories, maintain clinical documentation via electronic recordkeeping system



Impact on Career Goals
